

THE Kellin Guest House STORY

We are fortunate to have state of the art health care right in our backyard. Imagine if you had to travel many miles and stay away from home for days, weeks or even months to receive critical care for either yourself or a loved one. Where would you stay? How would you afford it? That is the reality for the families who stay at Kevin Guest House.

It was January 1972 when 13-year-old Kevin Garvey passed away. He had spent the last 18 months fighting leukemia, spending much of that time at Roswell Park Memorial Hospital. While at the hospital, Kevin's parents, Claudia and Cyril, witnessed the hardships of other families, who slept in their cars and waiting rooms because they were unable to afford lodging.

The Garveys wanted to help those families, so they purchased the property at 782 Ellicott Street and opened their doors in July 1972, welcoming people to Kevin Guest House. More than 60,000 guests, coming from Western New York, 49 states, Canada and 11 other countries, have stayed with us since then.

Located on the Buffalo Niagara Medical Campus, Kevin Guest House was the first healthcare hospitality house in the United States. We provide a comfortable home away from home for patients and their families who are seeking critical medical treatment at Buffalo-area hospitals and medical centers.

In August 2018, our campus grew to four properties as we opened the **Russell** J. Salvatore Hospitality House on the Kevin Guest House Campus, making us fully accessible for the first time and allowing us to serve more families. Our two main houses combine to offer 10 guest rooms, four family suites, common living and dining areas along with amenities from free laundry service and breakfast to our beautiful garden. The Russell J. Salvatore Hospitality House also includes two apartments, giving our campus a total of eight units which allow bone marrow and other transplant patients an environmentally safe place to recover within the required distance to their medical facility.

Mari, Kevin & Karen's daughter, is graduating from nursing school this evening, yet the family is here in spirit supporting the event, we will formally honor them at our 50th Anniversary Celebration on July 26th.



50th Anniversary – The Garvey's helped to start the healthcare hospitality movement that continues to directly impact guests today...

Our namesake Kevin Garvey was nicknamed "heart" by his family, which inspired our logo and that of hundreds of homes across the world. Before Kevin sadly succumbed to his illness, he was able to see the houses that would be named after him, but passed on January 14, 1972. His parents Cyril & Claudia continued their work to honor Kevin's legacy and opened the house to its first guest on July 26, 1972, with the support from then Roswell Park Memorial Hospital, so that future generations of patients & caregivers could focus on their health and worry less about the financial burdens that accompany life threatening illnesses away from home.

As brother Denis said, over the last 50 years, "Kevin Guest House has become a beacon of hope providing shelter, comfort, and understanding to those in times of incredible need". Now there are more than over 600 similar organizations worldwide and that small idea of the Garvey family has impacted millions along with over 60,000 families traveling to Buffalo for life-saving care. A treasure in the heart of the Buffalo Niagara Medical Campus and one of the

very best examples of the City of Good Neighbors, the work we do, directly provides the dignity, compassion and the "family" our guests need in some of the hardest days.

Kevin Garvey was nicknamed "heart," given after a family vacation because of his kindhearted nature. His mother Claudia said, "in the eighteen months that Kevin lived with his illness, that finally conquered even his stout heart, he served constantly as a model and an example for all of us." Reflecting on the past 50 years, much has changed on campus, but the heart of our mission has always remained. As brother Hugh said, "Kevin was only with us here on Earth for 13 short years, but he has left a good and kind and everlasting footprint on our world. May Kevin Guest House continue to serve those, like Kevin, at their most

needed time, with a place of comfort, love, and life. As sister Mary said, Kevin Guest House "shines through all of you who open his doors to all those in need".

As the inspiration for the Kevin Guest House, he was known of his open heart and loving spirit. In that tradition, the Kevin Garvey Award is given to a unique individual or organization that opens their heart to our home, showing their support and devotion to our guests and to the mission of Kevin Guest House. Kevin's siblings and family are asked to consider some of the most influential supporters of the house in recent history to honor with such an award. *This year, they couldn't think of any one more deserving to represent their brother than to honor the Durawa family, the late Kevin Durawa, his loving wife Karen, children Mari & Michael and immediate family for their unwavering support over the last two decades.*

The Impact of President Emeritus Kevin Durawa keeps the house going...

If you had the privilege to meet Kevin Durawa, you couldn't help but react to his positivity. If he didn't convince you to donate within a few minutes, he would find a way the next day. The kind of person who brought all walks of life to our campus because you couldn't help but have fun with Kevin.

Over nearly two decades, the Durawa family found unique ways to involve their circle of friends. Kevin was nominated as President Emeritus well before his diagnosis of ALS in 2020, an honor presented to him last year before he sadly passed in November 2021. Along with Dean Drew & Neil Farmelo, often attributed with saving the house from closing in the 90s, Kevin

can be attributed as one of the single most important influences in our organization's history.

Kevin served 11 years on the Board of Directors, with six as President. The capstone event in Kevin's time with KGH was his leadership of the House's first capital campaign during his time as President. It took a strong leader like Kevin to get constituents from all over the community to pull together to get us over the finish line of this transformational expansion. Kevin was the perfect person for this demanding job and the results laid a solid foundation for KGH to build upon in the decades to come.







Even after he left the Board, and as he fought through his illness, he continued to work on moving the house forward by serving on our Buildings and Grounds, and Special Initiatives committees.

Countless community leaders have worked alongside him to raise funds for the house. Kevin founded our Blues & Brews event, competed for most tickets sold with AI Ryer at Oktoberfest, raised the most online during our Fallfest Family Fun Run, chaired our Celebrity Golf Tournament, convinced vendors to donate services ranging from IT Support to building water trenches on, he always found a way to connect everyone to KGH. The most significant connection during his career at RealtyUSA was the years of support from Merle Whitehead's family and employees, which continues today at Howard Hanna. As a past Kevin

Garvey Award winner, there isn't one aspect of the house Kevin didn't have an influence on, but he and Karen never wanted recognition, always raising their hand when no one else could.

Current President, Jamie Scotland said "For many of us at KGH, Kevin was our leader, mentor, advocate, and cheerleader. I was privileged to call him my friend. KGH will miss the man who truly represents the heart and soul of Kevin Guest House."

THE IMPACT OF THE DURAWA FAMILY & EXTENDING FRIENDSHIPS

Even during his illness, Kevin and Karen considered his legacy to the house and his family, including kids Mari and Michael, how they would continue to support our guests. Over the years, while Kevin stood at the podium, Karen and immediate family often were the quiet influence that brought people back each year. All that he accomplished couldn't have been possible without them. Collectively, we can proudly say that with the help of Kevin & Karen's network, that our doors remained open during some of the most financial trying periods for KGH. All the "FUN" draisers they helped to organize and most especially, realizing the dream of over 20 years of expanding for the first time to serve double the number of guests. If you look around the room at our events, their influence is ever present, and we are certain many of you would raise your hand that you were first introduced in some way to our mission from their network of family.

While she doesn't feel worthy, Karen Durawa stood by her husband and impacted our successes more than she would ever recognize. While she prefers to stay out of the limelight, doing good deeds for our guests in the background, often the one out bidding you in our auctions, Karen continues to support the house and encourages her children Michael and Mari to continue to volunteer. Even a group of Checkers Club runners organized a run in Kevin's

memory, where the family showed up in droves on a chilly December to show support. Yet most significantly. Kevin and Karen are the first to leave a legacy gift to our guests in Kevin's memory, an important gift to both to always have their family connected to the house. The Garvey siblings have selected the Durawa family as our Kevin Garvey Awardee this year, which will be presented to Karen & her children at our Anniversary Celebration on July 26th, where we will unveil the entryway dedicated to the Durawa's that will welcome every quest to our main house. Mari, their daughter is graduating from UB Nursing School tonight and of course, Karen has made a personal gift and asked friends to attend in her place today. We hope you will join us at our upcoming events where we will feature the many ways this incredible family has impacted our guests. For now, as he would want it, let's raise a toast to Kevin & Karen and their extended family.



KGH50 CAMPAIGN

During the pandemic, shared common spaces & bathrooms in the aging original properties revealed greater risks to immunocompromised guests, with old HVAC systems and decades old materials being difficult to thoroughly clean. This campaign will allow the KGH to add private bathrooms in the main house, make durable upgrades in structure & safety and materials that are easier to clean and meet healthcare standards now requested to serve the most compromised patients & caregivers. The "KGH50" Campaign is a \$1.5 Million multi-project initiative to bring our three original properties up to the same standard of hospitality achieved by opening our newest building at 766 Ellicott Street for the long-term health, safety & comfort of guests.



Amy and Max Mantrew Rochester, NY



Max Mantrow is a 28-year-old bone marrow transplant patient who received treatment during his stay at Roswell Park Comprehensive Cancer Center from September 23, 2021 through the first week in November 2021. He was then given clearance to recover with his mother and caregiver, Amy in one of our transplant apartments! Amy found unique hobbies to stay busy at KGH since her check in with us during the fall. Additional family members back in Rochester included Max's father, Michael, sister, Gabriella, girlfriend, Michalena and son, Jesse.

Max had an Allo transplant, a procedure in which a patient receives healthy stem cells to replace their own stem cells that have been destroyed by treatment with radiation or high doses of chemotherapy. While Max received weekly treatments and physical therapy, he remained immune compromised and needed his mom to aid him with every step of the way before they could officially go home after their 104 days stay. While his close family visited on weekends from a safe distance, they celebrated most of the holiday season via Facetime and socially distanced to keep Max safe. This meant that they spent Thanksgiving, Christmas, Max's birthday and rang in the New Year with us. They celebrated the holiday season by decorating their apartment and baking Christmas cookies. They are both doing well back in Rochester and plan to visit during the summer to volunteer at the house!

Amy has always enjoyed teaching exercise and cleaning, but developed a new hobby during her time at KGH by learning to play ukulele. Amy said "I've been using this meditation bowl to instruct Max on how to meditate in order to decompress and relax while improving his health. We also find unique ways to exercise in the kitchen of the apartment". She also learned a new incredible strength in herself that she never experienced before. Max used his free time in the apartment to play video games and creating his own electronic music.



They both thanked KGH for letting them stay at the apartment and for making them feel so comfortable. Amy started to tear up while talking about their journey, but they both agreed that KGH has become a second home for them, and it's been a blessing for their family during one of the most difficult times in their lives.

It's not only a testament to being committed to one another, but also displays everlasting unity. The traditional gift for a 40th Anniversary is the ruby gemstone, which is a symbol of passion and strength. They celebrated this impressive milestone in April 2022; however, the strength and love in their family (and hometown) extends well beyond their relationship.

The Cochran's reside three hours away from Buffalo, in Oneida, NY. Since the summer of 2019, they've become quite familiar with WNY, as Robert underwent a bone marrow transplant at Roswell Park Comprehensive Cancer Institute in August. He learned of his illness in January, but due to his age, the procedure shortly followed as soon as a match was located.

The couple considered Kevin Guest House "home" from August 2019 until two days before Thanksgiving, when they were able to safely return to Oneida to celebrate the upcoming holiday season. During their

stay, Robert caught up on some much-needed rest, participated in word puzzles and took walks to regain his strength post-procedure. They stayed in the Upper Brick Apartment, where they enjoyed observing the traffic on the medical campus through the dining room windows. Linda commented that "the apartment felt homey and comforting, especially the front porch, to sit out on and get fresh air."

Unfortunately, there were other illnesses in the family, causing Linda to assist out of state. As a result, Robert's siblings and children served as an incredible support system, by taking turns visiting from across the country. He grew up in a large family and was able to reconnect with his nine siblings (Robert is a twin!), six children and grandchildren throughout his treatment in one way or another. Although it wasn't an ideal situation, looking back, Robert was thankful for the time to catch up with family. "Everybody was so excited and happy to see such a nice, clean and bright place to be in" according to Robert. He also added that Kevin Guest House "has helped many people get back on their feet."

The couple agreed that meals at night helped out a lot. It took one more burden away from them, so they could spend more quality time together. They both agreed that "if you needed, anything, the staff was always accommodating." The Cochran's found comfort in safely communicating with guests going through the same thing. They cannot thank the Kevin Guest House staff enough for "being so caring and accommodating. There's no stress when we stay here. We feel a sense of calmness being in the house."

After retirement, Robert stayed busy by making building repairs for nearby businesses. He was a regular at his local Lowes, so the staff became very familiar with the friendly and sociable customer. When he was away for many months receiving medical treatment, the Lowes employees were concerned of his whereabouts. After his recovery, he visited them and took a Kevin Guest House brochure. He explained to the staff what had happened, and after learning about the treatment Robert received at his "home away from home", the managers were inspired to show their love. Each visit the Cochran's make to KGH for checkups, they always show up with a carload of donations from Lowes, including hand sanitizer, facemasks and cleaning supplies. 


